

Dr. Suri earned her bachelor's degree in Biology with Honors from Florida International University before advancing to the Physician Associate program at Keiser University.

She began her career with a prominent pulmonary critical care group serving North Miami-Dade and South Broward counties in South Florida. Within a few years, she rose to the position of Chief Advanced Practice Provider (APP), overseeing APRNs and PAs responsible for the care of over 130 ICU patients daily before the COVID-19 pandemic.

Dr. Suri was instrumental in implementing educational programs, quality initiatives, and performance improvement processes, achieving a 40% reduction in ICU mortality rates and a 30% decrease in overall hospital mortality rates. Concurrently, she pursued a Doctorate in Medical Sciences from the University of Lynchburg, specializing in healthcare administration and law.

Following her doctorate, Dr. Suri became Chief Operating Officer of her group, managing pulmonary and critical care staff across five hospitals.—including facilities heavily impacted during the pandemic. She coordinated operations and led teams during one of South Florida's most challenging healthcare crises.

A passionate educator, Dr. Suri serves as an Adjunct Professor, delivering lectures on pulmonary and critical care medicine, legislation, leadership advocacy, and malpractice review. Beyond her clinical and academic roles, she is the South Regional Director for the Florida Academy of Physician Assistants (FAPA), and a Legislative committee member advocating for the profession through legislative efforts, media engagements, and mentorship.
